SUBJECT: U.S. Army Garrison Okinawa (USAG Okinawa) Energy and Water Conservation Policy

1. REFERENCES:

- a. Energy Policy Act of 2005, 29 July 2005.
- b. Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007, 19 December 2007.
- c. Executive Order 13423, Strengthening Federal Environmental, Energy and Transportation Management, 24 January 2007.
- d. IMCOM Pacific Region Energy and Water Management Policy Guidance, 13 February 2009.
- e. AR 420-1, Army Facilities Management, 12 February 2008 (RAR 24 August 2012).

2. PURPOSE: To incorporate the energy and water conservation goals established by the references below into the existing installation management structure.

3. APPLICABILITY: This policy applies to all personnel of USAG Okinawa, and other units or activities attached for the purpose of providing support. This includes all military personnel, civilian employees, Master Labor Contract (MLC) employees, Indirect Hire Agreement (IHA) personnel, and tenants and lessees. Also included are contractors performing on an USAG Okinawa installation for at least five consecutive days.

4. POLICY:

- a. USAG Okinawa strives to be a leader in environmental, energy and natural resources stewardship. USAG Okinawa will develop and manage programs and plans necessary to meet its responsibility to conserve resources, enhance environmental sustainability and protect human health.

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b. Leaders at every level are required to implement five major initiatives to include eliminating waste in existing facilities, increasing energy efficiency in new construction and renovations, reducing dependence on fossil fuels, conserving water resources, and improving energy security. Leaders shall also find the most cost-effective financing alternative to fund energy conservation and efficiency measures, to include Sustainment, Repair, & Modernization (SRM), Military Construction (MILCON), and alternative-financed programs with third-party financing.

c. USAG Okinawa will develop adequate energy staffing and support while investing in effective training and professional development.

5. COMMITMENT: USAG Okinawa is committed to providing safe, secure, compliant, and cost-effective energy and water services to Soldiers, Families, civilians and contractors on our installations while meeting or exceeding the various Federal energy goals and mandates by:

- a. Reducing total facility energy intensity by 3% per year thru FY2015.
- b. Increasing percentage of electricity coming from renewable sources.
- c. Reducing total water intensity by 2% per year thru FY 2020.
- d. Metering all facilities by 2020.
- e. Conducting energy and water audits for 25% of facilities annually.

7. This command policy will remain in effect until rescinded or superseded.
